Director's Note

Pride and Prejudice reimagined!

What does that mean? And why an all-woman cast?

Pride and Prejudice is a beloved classic. And much of it still rings true: The enduring strength of best friends, close siblings, family first. Celebrating a character like Lizzy, who goes against the grain and dares to think differently. The prejudice people face because of their "otherness," be it class, race or gender.

But "reimagined" means looking at parts of the story with a different lens - pointing up the silliness of the social mores of the time. The sting of women's social status is turned on its head because the swoony male characters are played by women actors who are having a hoot embodying these "dashing" and sometimes ridiculous men.

"Reimagined" means the makeup of the world of *Pride and Prejudice* includes some familiar modern things juxtaposed with the old-timey. What new insights into Jane Austen's beloved story would a mix of those two worlds bring?

And "reimagined" means puppets. And I must say the puppets have been delightful to work with. They are true professionals and I hope this launches their Boston theatre acting career. Stay tuned!
